The Great Siege of Rochester



Have you ever been to Rochester where the great castle still stands after hundreds of years? We are now going to tell you the story of that famous castle.

The castle was built to control the important river near it by the bishop of Rochester in the 1080s. It was a very modern castle for the time.

Due to the fact that the result of the siege would decide if the king stayed or had to leave the crown, the great siege of Rochester castle is probably the most famous siege of the medieval period. It's also the best documented of all medieval sieges.

The story began in 1204 when the king of England lost all his lands in France, so he raised huge amounts of money to recover his lands but to get this money he had to over-tax his barons. They complained but the king betrayed them and wanted to take the castle of Rochester, so the siege started and the rebels had to face the king's army.

The siege engines attacked the castle; however they couldn't destroy the strong walls so the king changed his strategy and killed pigs to start a fire under the tower.

Because of the burning props, the rebels had to go deeper into the castle to avoid the fire. Some of our journalists told us that a small number of the rebels were allowed to leave the castle but they had their hands and feet cut off!

Because of the winter the starving rebels that remained in the castle had to surrender but only one rebel was hanged.

During the 13th century, the new king rebuilt a part of the castle and added a few residential buildings, unfortunately, in 1264 another siege happened and these buildings were destroyed.

Then, the castle remained unused for centuries before it was sold to Rochester Corporation and opened to the public in 1870.



ART SECTION: King's college Chapel



THIS BEAUTIFUL CHURCH IS LOCATED IN CAMBRIDGE, WHICH IS A UNIVERSITY CITY AND A COUNTY TOWN OF CAMBRIDGESHIRE. IT IS LOCATED ON THE RIVER CAM NORTH OF LONDON. KING'S COLLEGE CHAPEL IS A HUGE BUILDING OF GOTHIC ARCHITECTURE. IT WAS STARTED IN 1446 BY HENRY VI AND WAS ACHIEVED IN 1515.

It has the largest vault in the world and some of the most gorgeous medieval stained glass. During the $2^{\rm ND}$ world war, these glasses were removed to be protected of the Germans' bombings and show some passages of the Bible. The decorations which are present in the chapel represent mainly the royal power with fewer religious signs, except in the last room of the Chapel.



EACH YEAR, FOR THE CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE, ONE OF THE MOST FAMOUS CHOIRS IN THE WHOLE OF GREAT BRITAIN IS BROADCAST TO MILLIONS OF PEOPLE AROUND THE WORLD. THE CHAPEL IS IMPORTANT FOR THE COLLEGE LIFE. IT WAS BUILT FOR THE COLLEGE SCHOLARS, AND TODAY THE CHOIR STILL SINGS EVENSONG DAILY DURING TERM TIME.

SINCE 1968, TOURISTS HAVE HAD THE HONOR OF SEEING THE FAMOUS PAINTING OF RUBENS: "ADDRATION OF THE MAGI". IN THIS WORK OF ART, RUBENS REPRESENTED THE THREE WISE MEN STARING AT JESUS CHRIST. THIS PAINTING WAS GIVEN BY ALFRED ERNEST ALLNATT, A MILLIONAIRE.


